

2026 General Assembly Session Begins

Now is the time that the MRSPA Legislative Committee really gets to work. The 90-day General Assembly session began on January 14, 2026. Also in January, we will hold our annual Legislative Workshop by Zoom and hold our first committee meeting of the session. Thereafter, we will meet every two weeks to review proposed legislation, continuing to look out for the interests of retired school personnel, with protection of our defined benefit pension always our top priority. Watch your email inbox throughout the session for the MRSPA Legislative Update that will show the bills the committee is following and the positions taken.

Additionally, every member of the General Assembly will receive from MRSPA an electronic letter that includes our 2026 Legislative Priorities brochure and National Institute on Retirement Security (NIRS) *Pensionomics* flyer. It also contains information that both introduces the legislators to MRSPA and our priorities and clearly explains the importance of our defined benefit pension to retirees and to the economy of the state of Maryland.

One big change this year is that the House of Delegates has elected Joseline Pena-Melnyk (Prince George's, Anne Arundel) as the new Speaker of the House of Delegates to replace Adrienne Jones, who resigned as Speaker. Lots of changes have occurred in terms of the committee structure and leadership in the House as a result.

Issues that have been identified that will be dealt with by the General Assembly include the following: \$1.4 billion budget deficit; rising energy costs, and how to deal with data centers; affordability; Chesapeake Bay restoration; education, and the funding of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future; immigration; the rebuilding of the Francis Scott Key Bridge; health care, including federal changes that may affect Medicaid, Medicare, and the Affordable Care Act Exchange; and vaccine protocol. Because it is an election year, we do not expect tax increases to be considered.

Many of these mentioned issues are not included in our MRSPA Legislative Priorities, but your committee will keep close tabs on proposed bills to see that the priorities and interests of our members are protected.

I am not a doctor, and I don't play one on TV. I am struck, however, when I read or hear about loneliness and social connection or disconnection, especially among the senior/retired population. I have not done the research, and I have surely not read all of it. I have read various articles from AARP and from the Surgeon General on the topic. I don't think it takes a doctor or rocket scientist to know that these are serious issues to be addressed.

First, loneliness and social isolation are not the same thing. Loneliness is a feeling that we all can have at various times, even when we are with other people. It is associated with a greater risk of cardiovascular disease, dementia, stroke, depression, anxiety, and premature death. According to the Surgeon General, the mortality aspect of being socially disconnected is similar to smoking 15 cigarettes a day, and greater than that associated with obesity and physical inactivity. A society that lacks social connection can be felt in our schools, workplaces, and civic organizations, where performance, productivity, and engagement are diminished. It can also cause us to retreat further into our corners, being angry, sick, and alone. Who really

wants to be angry, sick, or alone? Not this writer.

So, what can we do? We can start by strengthening the connections and relationships in our own lives. Answer that call, email, or text from a friend. Make time to share a meal. Listen without the distraction of your phone. Ask for help. Perform an act of service. Say yes to that request to join in an activity. Make plans and follow through. Take a walk with a friend or loved one. Enjoy the sights, sounds, and smells of nature.

I don't want to oversimplify this serious issue. But if you are looking for a way to get or stay connected in 2026, MRSPA and your local association are great places to start. Lots of members with shared history as well as fascinating differences and experiences are looking for someone new to meet or to rekindle an old friendship. If you don't like the idea of committing to a leadership position, just join a committee, or plan to attend a luncheon or happy hour or community service activity. Think of your local association and MRSPA as a nearby, convenient treatment for loneliness and social isolation. And you don't need to see a doctor for a prescription. Just show up. We need you.

Work History

Dr. John Bowman is Vice Provost, Emeritus and a former professor and chair of the political science department at Frostburg State University. He retired from FSU on July 1, 2018.

While at Frostburg State University, Dr. Bowman established partnerships and cooperative degree programs with universities in Europe, China, and Taiwan.

His work to create overseas partnerships dramatically increased international student enrollment and faculty exchanges at Frostburg, enhanced the internationalization of the campus, and greatly extended the university's global presence. He has also teamed with English language schools to bring international students to Frostburg State University.

The professional and leadership background of Dr. Bowman includes planning and creating innovative campus-wide educational programs at Frostburg State University; preparing important Frostburg State University studies and documents required by the University System of Maryland, the Maryland Higher Education Commission, and the Middle States Commission on Higher Education; and serving as the university's representative on regional community boards and planning committees.

Dr. Bowman holds an undergraduate degree in education from The Ohio State University, a master's degree in diplomacy from the Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce at the University of Kentucky, and a doctorate in international affairs from the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh.

John is excited about the opportunity to step further into MRSPA leadership to continue his work for MRSPA members statewide.

Annual Business Meeting Procedure Reminder

As we are preparing for the 2026 Annual Business Meeting on May 5, 2026, we want to remind delegates of the long-standing MRSPA Board Policy for making motions during the meeting. The policy is Article XI. Annual Meeting:

Motions which set policy or which require action must be submitted to the President in time to be distributed to the Board of Directors and local association presidents at least 30 days prior to the Annual Business Meeting. Motions which reverse or significantly alter current policy will be tabled for additional study until the next meeting, unless they represent an emergency. Consideration of an emergency motion requires a two-thirds majority of voting members present and a two-thirds majority for the motion to pass. No motions will be considered at the Annual Meeting unless this procedure has been followed.

For 2026, thirty days before the Annual Business Meeting is April 5. Should a delegate wish to make a motion during the Annual Meeting, this means that it must be submitted to the President well prior to April 5, 2026, to allow time for the motion to be shared with the full Board of Directors and local association presidents by April 5.

The President requests that any planned motions be submitted to the President by March 26, 2026, to allow time for sharing and consideration prior to the Annual Business Meeting in accordance with the policy.
