About the MRSPA Foundation

In 1999, longtime MRSPA members Irl and Ella Beall bequeathed \$50,000 to the Association to create the *Foundation*. After studying who might benefit most from the donation, it was decided that these monies would be used to help uncertificated employees in the public school systems of the state achieve Maryland Teacher Certification. Since that time, the Foundation's purpose has been amended to also provide grants to teachers to enhance their regular classroom curriculum.

The first two \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to personnel in Frederick and Somerset counties in 2000. *Sixty-one* more awards have been granted to date. Since 2014, three \$2,000 scholarships have been awarded annually. In 2022 and 2023, four \$2,000 scholarships were awarded.

Scholarship application instructions are sent annually to all public school systems and MRSPA local affiliates. Applications are reviewed and recipients selected by members of the MRSPA Scholarship Committee. Scholarship winners are notified in March. All recipients are invited to the MRSPA Annual Business Meeting in May.

Administering the MRSPA Foundation

The MRSPA Foundation is now administered by The MRSPA Foundation Board. It is an endowment fund managed by Lincoln Financial, Inc. The Foundation was created so that contributions by members/friends are fully tax deductible. The Foundation investment managers invest the principal in products approved by the Foundation Board. All donations are acknowledged by the MRSPA Foundation. Quarterly financial reports are provided.

From the Chair

The *MRSPA Foundation* depends on the market value of our investments, our fundraisers, and the generosity of our members. With the rising cost of tuition and the financial struggle that students face, it is becoming more and more difficult to get the required certification even though they are employed, with some working more than one job. The *MRSPA Foundation* is designed to help these individuals. It is imperative that we continue to keep qualified personnel in our schools.

Distributions from the *Foundation* are used to provide scholarships to non-certificated employees in the Maryland public schools to become certificated teachers.

The *Foundation* may also support scholarships for certificated teachers and non-certificated employees who are pursuing the certification to become a school counselor, a speech and language pathologist, a physical or occupational therapist, a school social worker, a media specialist, or a school psychologist. Teachers who have a current certification and are enrolled in a program pursuing certification in another education area are also eligible to apply for the scholarship.

We encourage all MRSPA members to help us continue to provide scholarships by donating to the *Foundation*, by increasing your donation to the *Foundation* in the memory of a loved one, or in lieu of a gift to a person who has all that they need.
